CHECK-IN WITH PETE

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN OUR WOODS?

Our First Woods are Complete:

We removed vacuum boosters and retral fitted it with a two-line wet and dry system connected to all the lateral mainlines (A refresher from last month)!

Our Second Woods are Complete:

The woods are now blanketed in snow, covering the areas where we mulched the underbrush. We're eager to see how much regrowth will occur over the next year. In some sections, we mulched both the underbrush and leftover logging debris, while in others, we left the logging brush untouched. This will help us compare which approach promotes better regrowth. On a brighter note, our tubing system is all set and ready to go.

The Third Woods We're Finshing Soon:

We have about 40 acres to do of tubing and will finish it up by the end of the month!

GETTING READY FOR MAPLE SEASON!

WHAT THINGS SHOULD I DO OR CHECK?

Woods and tubing systems checklist:

- Check mainlines to make sure they are tight and sag free
- Remove any limbs or branches before snow
- Check 5/16" or 3/16" lines for any damage and make the repairs now
- Last minute tubing sanitization
 - Calcium hypochlorite can be used
 - Make sure the sanitizer is food grade
 - Concentration of the product should be 200 ppm

Vacuum pumps & releasers checklist:

- Change oil on vacuum pumps prior to the weather getting cold (moisture will freeze in the oil)
- Check diaphragms on diaphragm pumps
- Clean the air inlet screen below the check valve on rotary vane vacuum pumps
- Clean and service mechanical releasers (the higher the vacuum level the more moisture in the system)
- Drain check valves on electric releasers
- Clean suction screens on electric releasers
- Check floats and switches on moisture traps

Wood evaporator checklist:

- Stacks
- Firebrick
- Arch rail gaskets
- Grates
- Insulation
- Float box gaskets

Oil evaporator checklist:

- Burner nozzles
- Fuel filters
- Tune up (New nozzles & combustion check)

Reverse osmosis checklist:

- Membranes stored where they will not freeze
- Do your membranes need to be cleaned?
- Do you have your yearly consumables(filters, soap, etc.)?
- Calibration packets and new batteries for ph meter



MAPLE SEASON CHECKLIST CONT.

Taps checklist:

- Replace tubing taps (early deployment is ok on tubing taps)
- New taps will yield 17% more sap than a used tap
- If you are using cast aluminum or stainless taps sanitize before the season
- Sanitizer: Calcium hypochlorite or Sodium hypochlorite

Bag holders & buckets checklist:

- Buckets should be sanitized before use
- New sap bags should be used every year
- Do you have enough bags for animal and storm damage?

Measuring devices checklist:

- Do you have calibration solution for your refractometer?
- Distilled water can be used for sap refractometers
- Do you have calibration packets for your PH Meter?
- Batteries
- Check your hydrometer to make sure it is free of cracks and can be easily read
- Do you have a spare?

Filters & bulk storage checklist:

- Make sure filter bags are clean and odor-free
- Do you have pre-filters in stock?
- Press papers and DE power
- Drums for bulk storage
- Sample bottles and covers

Best practices:

- Assemble your evaporator and other maple equipment in early winter to make sure you find all the parts
- Keep a notebook in the sugarhouse to log items that need to be repaired before the next season
